| Swimming lessons for an additional KS2 class. | £3060 | To enable children to develop their swimming skills rapidly, with ease and with confidence. To swim regularly and to encourage confidence in future competition |
| Develop sport leadership in children | £200 | More children are active at playtimes and lunch times. Children are offered a wider variety of games that children can take part in. There is an increased interest and enjoyment for children in new group games and better behaviour and interactions at break times. Children develop movement, coordination and sport skills |
| Professional development – Release for P.E leader to attend borough P.E meetings and CPD training sessions across the year. | £150 | Leader is provided with ideas, resources and activity packs that are shared with colleagues across the school. Leader has increased subject knowledge and confidence in teaching the aims of the curriculum. |
| Improve dance facilities by installing a new sound system within the hall. | £1000 | More children engage in dance and take part in after school activities and interschool competitions. |
